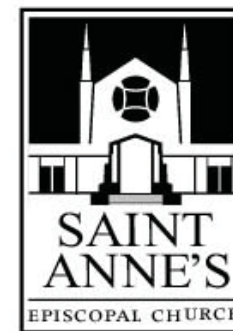

THE REV. MILTON H. MURRAY WILL PREACH AT BOTH SERVICES TODAY TO CELEBRATE THE 50TH ANNIVERSARY OF HIS ORDINATION

A native of Georgia, Milton was ordained at St. Philip's Cathedral following his graduation from the Virginia Theological Seminary in June 1958. His first assignment was two mission churches in northeast Georgia. One of these was Grace Church, Clarkesville, the oldest Episcopal church building in Georgia, and the other was Calvary Church, Cornelia, where he met and married Jane. During this time he also served as manager of Camp Mikell, Toccoa, the diocesan camp and conference center. In 1964, came a move to St. Stephen's, Milledgeville, and in 1970 to St. Bede's, Atlanta.

In 1984, Milton was called to the Diocese of Florida where he served at Christ Church, Ponte Vedra Beach, until his 1991 retirement, which lasted about one week before he accepted an offer to become chief chaplain and full-time director of a nationwide interdenominational chaplaincy program. In 1999 he returned to Christ Church, serving first as a pastoral associate and then as priest-in-charge of a newly established Christ Church mission in South Ponte Vedra Beach. At age 75, Milton told his bishop it was time to retire again. Jane and Milton returned to Atlanta in early 2007 and now live at Canterbury Court and attend St. Anne's.

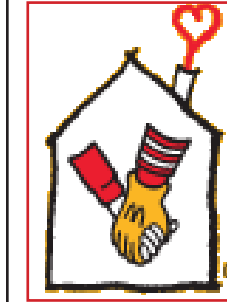
