KENYAN CHILDREN'S MISSION

Fredrick Gituku will report on the 2007 grant of \$5000 from the St. Anne's Missions Committee for his mission to the children of the Kikuyu area of Kenya, where he grew up, and from where he returned in January. The \$5000 is the second grant to Fredrick: in 2006 he was given \$2000 by St. Anne's via the Missions Committee. 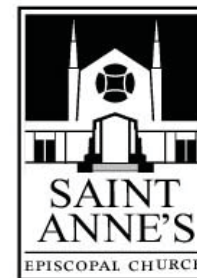

- Become the "pebble-in-the-pond" to roll this out to the Atlanta community at large
