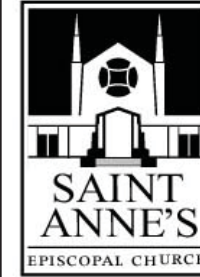

HOW 45 MINUTES IN THE PARISH HALL

IMPACTED CHILDREN 8597 MILES AWAY

On Sunday April 27th Fredrick Gituku presented to 60 parishioners at adult education the story of how the 2007 Missions Grant of \$5000 from St. Anne's was used in Kenya. The residual \$300 was used to hire a professional teacher of math, science, and social studies for the 4th thru 8th grade at the Compass School, which is staffed solely by volunteers. The \$300 paid his \$100 a month salary thru May of this year. Because of the generosity of the people present, who gave \$2181, Fredrick now has the money to pay Mr. Nganga for the next ten months, and to hire a second math, science and social studies teacher for the 1st thru 3rd grade. Together they will teach 300 children. Thanks, St. Anne's.

Emmaus House, the Episcopal Diocese of Atlanta's inner-city outreach ministry, is accepting applications for four to six summer internships. Designed for college students, the internships extend from May 28 through Aug. 9. During the last week, all interns and staff travel with youngsters to Camp Mikell in the North Georgia mountains. Interns will work in several areas including a day camp for children in grades K-5, a senior citizens' program, arts programs and the onsite Poverty Rights Office. One intern position will concentrate specifically on coordinating weekly service projects for youth groups coming to Emmaus House from all over the nation throughout the summer.
